

MINIMUM REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

Education: A bachelor's degree is required.

Experience: At least two years of rodeo experience is required; college rodeo experience is preferred.

License: Possession of a driver's license is required.

Skills: Experience with college rodeo is preferred. Experience with heavy/light equipment such as tractors, skid steers, water trucks, and/or arena groomers. Experience working on a farm or ranch and performing work such as caring for livestock. The ability to develop knowledge of, respect for, and skills to engage with those of other cultures or backgrounds is required.

Effort: Requires the ability to work outdoors in all types of weather. Requires the ability to lift and transport agricultural supplies and equipment weighing up to 70 pounds on a frequent basis and up to 100 pounds on an occasional basis; prolonged walking and standing; frequent bending, stooping, kneeling, and reaching on a daily basis. Requires a full range of physical motion in order to operate manual, electrically-powered and diesel- or gasoline-powered farm machinery, tools, and equipment. Requires the ability to access areas that may only be accessible by climbing ladders. Must be able to move throughout the assigned area.

Other: The scope of the position may include interaction with rough stock.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Provide proper care and management of the college-owned and leased livestock used for rodeos and practice events, including proper feeding and nutrition, doctoring, and transportation
2. Maintain and prepare all rodeo facilities and equipment, including practice arenas and stall barns
3. Assist coach with management and training/practices as needed
4. Assist with the annual college rodeo, when applicable
5. Help with preparation of fundraisers, clinics, and other events organized by the rodeo team and coach
6. Support the recruitment and growth of overall program
7. Assist coach and other athletic administration with web, marketing, and social media
8. Assist coach with various campus and community groups on behalf of the program
