## New Business

Dr. King stated that Dr. Smith has contacted her with concerns about the "Grading and Credit Point System" chart (<u>https://www.missouristate.edu/registrar/catalog/grades.htm</u>) which is for undergraduate students only. Should a chart be developed for graduate students with grades and descriptions that are allowed and acceptable for graduate programs? Secondly, plus/minus grading is an issue in some departments. Since faculty are allowed to decide if they use plus/minus grading there are courses in departments where one section is subject to plus/minus grading and other sections use regular grading. This greatly affects a student if they are given a C- versus a C. A graduate student can use a C on a graduate program but a C- cannot be used. Is this grading policy still appropriate?

Dr. King asked for volunteers for an ad hoc committee to discuss these issues and report back to Council. Volunteers included Dr. Smith, Dr. Swan and Dr. Kaatz and a representative from the Faculty Senate Executive Committee. Drs. King and Masterson will contact others to be on the committee.

# **Open** Mic

Dr. Gouzie reported that he recently discovered that the National Gem and Mineral Organization have given scholarships to geology students for over 50 years. Until recently, these scholarships were generally given to undergraduates but the organization has now decided to give them to graduate students. They contacted Dr. Gouzie who recommended 2 MSU geology graduate students who each received a \$4,000 scholarship.

Dr. Barffour announced that the Modern and Classical Languages department has been renamed World Languages and Cultures. This department now houses the undergraduate global studies degree.
